"It's a visually stunning film with the use of colours cleverly telling a story," she explains. "I cannot wait for it to hit the film festival circuit."

She is currently working behind the scenes developing her own TV web series. "I can't say too much about it just yet, but episodes are

set to include some well-known industry peers. I'm excited to be producing my own creative work. Once I can say more - I'll let North Shore Living readers be the first to know..." she says.

As a regular at Ensemble Theatre in Kirribilli on and off the stage, Ms Corren says the iconic venue is close to her heart, primarily because her favourite production to act in to date, CAMP, was performed there in September last year.

"I'd wanted to perform at the Ensemble for ages and when I finally got the chance I was so excited. CAMP had a wonderful cast and the director Mark

Kilmurry was a joy to work with.

"I love the intimacy of the Ensemble stage, but more so the energy of the people who work there. Everyone is such a delight it really is like a big family and I love that. I always feel welcome."

So apart from learning her lines, producing, and all things acting (as well as being a life coach), Ms Corren says she likes to keep a balance between her personal and professional life.

"There is a huge crossover between my 'on' and 'off' time. My focus is on living a joyous life and doing things that make me feel good.
